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Terry Lovell KYTC stated projected completion is 2025 to 2026, the Road Plan has been chosen, and (NEPA) National environmental protection agency has completed their study and Phase 2 right of way. Funds being requested for appraisal of impacted land/properties. Utility movement takes 6 to 18 months probably 2024 to 25. Bob asked about the \$250,000.00 which should be available with the 1st building permit. Is it possible for metro to buy the property and sign over Terry and Jerry answered no the project is past that phase.

Kristen McNair stated student assignments plan for the new middle school will be for most students traveling to Shelbyville rd. to be local and few Left turns will be needed. Ralph asked about round- abouts and the States consideration in this situation. Terry Lovell stated they were not considered due to the placement of the intersection and the fire dept.

Follow up on proposed shopping center

Paul Deines reported KYTC and Planning Commission didn't approve the plan submitted by the builder. The commission wants to keep the connecter road from Brookfield to the shopping center.

Does not want the grade raised 10 ft. per the builders plans Also concerns about traffic flow and entrances and exits.

New Business

Discussion on suggestion to allow Stop 1614Johnson Rd on using our tax exempt status to collect funds. Per Bob's inquiry to Stephan Porter Attorney at Law regarding this issue." Liability, EVC could be held liable if STOP committed any fraudulent or libelous acts. But opposing an issue in a reasonable manner should not open up either group to liability"
