Call to order: Bob Federico 6:30 P.M.

Chair Report: Bob Federico

- Restructure of intersection in front of fire house.
 - o Bob Federico, representative from KYTC and KCPTS were interviewed by WHAS TV
 - O Next step try to meet with Lt. Governor or Governor
- Storage Unit on US 60
 - Developers listened to community concerns
 - Wed. EVC to propose binding elements
 - No external storage of items
 - All items must be stored inside a storage unit.

Secretary Report:

Beth Henderman presented the January Minutes prepared by Sean Corser. John Darling approved the Minutes as presented. Lucas Frazier seconded. Passed unanimously.

Treasurer Report: John Darling.

Opening Balance: Jan 1, 2023, \$12,992.45 **Earmarked Funds** Legal \$2578.23 and Community \$1000. **Available funds** are \$9414.22. Zach Wildman moved the Treasurer Report be received as presented. Ralph Langdon seconded. Passed unanimously.

Incorporation:

- The committee met with the Mayors of Middletown and Douglass Hills, representatives from the League of Cities and Department of Insurance.
- What are realistic goals for our area?
- What will our boundaries be?
 - O How do we determine and get continuity?
 - o How do we obtain homeowner petition signatures?

- Struggle: are the boundaries we establish today our final boundaries or will be able to annex the new developments within our boundary?
- Trying to estimate the amount of income Eastwood will receive so as to determine what services we can offer.
- Guest question: How do we get the word out to residents?

- Has been managing the market for 7 years.
- Sean Corser new 2023 Market Manager
 - o Market Date Open Sat. through May 13 through Sept. 30.
 - o 80-90 % of past vendors returning
 - o Working on obtaining new vendors and more sponsors
 - Working on pamphlet for new sponsors
 - Working on budget
 - Working on having event Saturdays
 - o Emphasis on more Social Media to publicize the Farmers Market
 - Would like to have a steering committee made up of vendors and board members.

Land Development and Permitting John Darling chair had Lucas Frazier give the updates

- 1505 Echo Trail meeting Thursday Feb. 23
- 1614 Johnson Road
 - o 3/16 development goes before Planning commission
- Parklands Terrace
 - o 160 apartments with historic home
 - Have redone plan
 - o Development not yet submitted to Planning commission
 - Possibly another public meeting before plan finalized for submission

Old Business.

- All board members and Eastwood residents need to respond to Planning and Zoning notices.
 - Send in a written response.
 - o Discuss traffic...too many cars for the area
 - Lack of safety

New Business:

- Discussion about how does EVC positions/concerns get on public record
 - Concerns about traffic, new developments meeting needs of community, no DRO development,
 Traffic safety on out dated infra structure.
- John Darling moved that Lucas Frazier prepare a paper, as if coming from the EVC, stating the EVC position on DRO concerns, slopes, flooding to be presented at Planning and Zoning meetings.
 Chuck Melander seconded.
 - When completed and approved by the Board it will be put on our web site.
 - Will be a part of our presentation when EVC members speak at Planning and Zoning about developments that violate the DRO guidelines.
